Exciting Building News

Thank you to the many parents who have been to see me about the building work that is being carried out in the Ethel Road Playing Fields. I share your excitement, but I can also confirm that the first of our new buildings is due to be delivered on **Monday 9th October 2023**. This will be the main block that contains the new school hall (which is actually bigger than the current hall), all of the offices, a reception area, and classroom spaces for the Orchard, Chestnut, and Willow. Soon after this, although a date has not yet been agreed, the 2nd block will arrive. This will accommodate all of the classrooms for years 1-6. I am so happy that we are able to see such good progress, and know that you will all be looking forward to the time that our school can come back together again!

I know that a number of parents have experienced frustration about the bus service, and the late arrival of the 2nd and 3rd buses. We share your views on this and I am working closely with the DfE to secure a higher commitment to a minimum service standard from Confidence, the bus company that supplies the buses, daily. While we all understand that sometimes buses can be late, we also feel that real-time communication could be helpful, especially if the buses are going to be much later than we expect. With this in mind, we are looking at setting up a WhatsApp group that will give a live notification of when each bus leaves the Judgemeadow site.
